

'I have just finished, 'The Questions Christians hope no one will ask (with answers)' by Mark Mittelberg. These questions were 'uncovered' during a national poll in the US. However you could guess most of them, without such an exercise in this



country. "Why do you believe God exists at all?...Why would God allow evil and suffering?...Why are Christians against same-sex people getting married?...Why trust the Bible when it's full of mistakes?... How could a loving God send people to hell?...What makes you think Jesus was more than just a good teacher?...Why are Christians so judgmental?" The answers are very well presented. They are not a series of
