Gaza Crisis Appeal

The Archbishop in Jerusalem is appealing to all people of goodwill to support this humanitarian mission through their generous contributions to Al Ahli Hospital in Gaza.

Over recent days, the rapid escalation of violence throughout the Holy Land has led to a heart-breaking situation in the region. Families are being bombed from their homes, medical supplies are running out and there is a

desperate need for fuel to keep generators going. In the air, attacks have been launched against Gaza and central Israel. On the ground, there has been rioting between extremists in ethnically mixed cities in particular over the pending evictions in the Sheikh Jarrah neighbourhood. Scores have been killed; many have been injured.



It's really hard to know what to do in a practical sense with the current crisis in the Holy Land.

One way would be to donate to the Christian Hospital which is situated in Gaza. They minister to a predominantly Muslim population.

"Take nothing for the journey..." (Luke 9v3)

"- no staff, no bag, no bread, no money, no extra shirt." What on earth was Jesus thinking?



Our church is organising a weekend away soon, and there's a Street Pastor refresher day soon too... Please bring a mask or visor, Are you vegetarian for catering purposes? Places to park your car? Bring a waterproof etc...!

Jesus said take nothing for the journey.

When I thought about it, I think what he means is "Don't get weighed down by the preparation, don't let the fact that you've no bread put you off going, no clean shirt? - just crack on with it!". Certainly Luke 9 isn't filled with the complaints of returning hungry and dirty disciples, rather they "went from village to village, proclaiming the good news and healing people everywhere".

I reckon it's all about trust and faith. Jesus sent them out. God provided. Mission accomplished.

This weekend we pray for our teams as they set foot onto the streets of Preston, for some it will have been a while. We trust that God provides for their journey around town, that people meet and welcome Jesus into their lives, we pray for conversations, leading to actions. We trust and have faith. Jesus is sending us out. (But we're still taking our rucksacks and will have a clean shirt on..!)
